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Summary of Albert Pinkham Ryder. Albert Pinkham Ryder was the only American painter whose work was hung in the same gallery as the honoured European masters of the modern, C\u00e9zanne, van Gogh, Gauguin, Manet, at the landmark 1913 Armory Show in New York, the exhibition that virtually defined modern in art and introduced the term avant-garde into the way we talk about art. Yet Ryder's approach to his own work was deeply personal, inventive, idiosyncratic, obsessive, and disregarding of "isms."
