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One of Jesus' 12 disciples was known as Simon the Zealot (Matthew 10:4; Mark 3:18; Luke 6:15; Acts 1:13). Who were the Zealots? The Zealots were a political movement among Jews who sought to overthrow the occupying Roman government. The term Zealots comes from the Greek word zelotes that means emulator or zealous follower.

Who were the Zealots in the New Testament?

Zealots were one of several New Testament period Jewish political movements. The Historian Josephus states, regarding this fourth of four major sects that existed in the first century A.D. (the others in the Bible being Pharisees, Sadducees and Essenes), "But of the fourth sect of Jewish philosophy (the zealots), Judas the Galilean was the author" (Antiquities of the Jews, Book 18, Chapter 1, Section 6).

Both Simon and Matthew, though natural enemies, were part of the Twelve. What a beautiful illustration of the peace Jesus brings! Today, God still brings healing and changes lives.

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Although he identifies himself as a “ genuinely committed disciple of Jesus of Nazareth ” – the Zealot, not the Christ or Savior, he has returned to Islam. The Zealots were a "fourth sect", founded by Judas of Galilee (also called Judas of Gamala) in the year 6 CE against the Census of Quirinius, shortly after the Roman Empire declared what had most recently been the tetrarchy of Herod Archelaus to be a Roman province, and that

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Zealot, member of a Jewish sect noted for its uncompromising opposition to pagan Rome and the polytheism it professed. The Zealots were an aggressive political party whose concern for the national and religious life of the Jewish people led them to despise even Jews who sought peace and conciliation with the Roman authorities.

Jesus' teachings (such as turning the other cheek and loving your enemies) were often the complete opposite of the ideology the Zealots embraced. Although it's worth noting, in the Talmud, Jewish rabbis advocated for peace as well, and the Zealots ignored them.

Jesus Christ is believed by many notable historians and biblical scholars to have leanings toward being a non-violent type of zealot. The term "zealot", in Hebrew means one who is zealous on behalf of God. The term derives from Greek (zelotes), "emulator, fanatic, admirer or follower".
