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**Malaysia Malaria Guidelines**
Ensuring prompt malaria diagnosis, treatment and surveillance in remote, hard-to-reach regions played a key role in Malaysia's elimination success. However, the risk of imported malaria remains a key concern. Temporary foreign workers in Malaysia, many of whom are undocumented, may expose the local population to the disease.

**Malaysia: Malaria | IAMAT**

In low malaria endemic areas, in addition to ACT, all individuals (except in children < 30 kg, pregnant women or breastfeeding women of infants aged < 6 months) diagnosed with P. falciparum malaria, should be given a single dose of 0.25 mg/kg primaquine to reduce the risk of transmission. 3

**Malaysia Malaria Map - Fit for Travel**

The guidelines continue to highlight that long-term VFR visitors run a higher risk of acquiring malaria than short term travellers to the same location. Furthermore, once infected, the risk of developing severe or complicated malaria is higher in certain groups, such as the elderly (over 70 years old), the immunosuppressed, those with complex co-morbidities and pregnant women.

**Malaria prevention guidelines for travellers from the UK ...**

Diagnosis – Travellers who develop a fever of 38°C [100°F] or higher more than one week after being in a malaria risk area, or who develop any symptoms suggestive of malaria within a year of return should seek immediate medical care. Emergency standby treatment may be considered for those going to remote areas with limited access to medical attention.

In light of the differing logistical and technical challenges in each region of the country, Malaysia has a geographically phased malaria elimination goal of zero local transmission for West Malaysia by 2015, and 2020 for Sabah and Sarawak.

All travelers should seek medical attention in the event of fever during or after return from travel to areas with malaria. 5. This risk estimate is based largely on cases occurring in US military personnel who travel for extended periods of time with unique itineraries that likely do not reflect the risk for the average US traveler.

**Guidelines for malaria prevention in South East Asia**

Malaria should be suspected in children with any febrile illness if they have travelled to a region where malaria is endemic
Artemether-lumefantrine is the treatment of choice for uncomplicated Plasmodium falciparum malaria
Infection with P. vivax, P. ovale (or an unknown species) must be treated with primaquine to prevent relapse
