Vacutainer tubes are covered with a Color-coded plastic cap that indicates which additives the tube contains. These color indicators help the phlebotomist to easily select the tubes in which the blood should be drawn as per the tests that have to be performed.

~~COLOR CODES OF VACUTAINER TUBES AND ITS USES~~

Phlebotomy tubes with green top contain sodium herapin, lithium herapin and ammonium herapin, all of which are coated in the inside of the tube. The herapin anticoagulant activates antithrombins that block the coagulation cascade and produce a plasma sample or whole blood. The same tubes are used for clinical chemistry and STAT chemistry tests.

Serum tubes (with or without clot activator) 4. Green top tubes (sodium or lithium heparin) 5. Lavender or pink top tubes (Potassium EDTA) 6.

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The basic order of draw followed by most phlebotomy laboratories is as follows: Yellow Top (or Yellow-Black). This tube is used for blood cultures.

Laboratory Specimen Tube Type Collection Chart. Draw in the order shown on the chart from left to right order, Label AT THE BEDSIDE, Timely DELIVERY to the LAB. Mix all tubes gently 5-10 times by inverting immediately after collection. Color blocks below correspond to patient bedside visual reference used at SPH following mistake proofing.

In phlebotomy, this term has special meaning as it is the order in which certain tubes can be used. There are seven tubes which make up the order of draw. They are listed by chemical additives that have been introduced to the tube by the manufacturer to perform a specific function when mixed with the blood.

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The gel-barrier tube is an additive tube and should be inverted five to six times after collection. Allow the tube to stand for 30 to 60 minutes for complete clotting to occur prior to centrifugation. Vacuum Tubes Without Anticoagulants. When using vacuum tubes containing no additives: Permit the tube to fill completely.

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
